1. Go to the Bakersfield College library website:

2. Click on **EBSCOhost** near the top right of the page.






3. Click on the first link, **Academic Search Premier**.



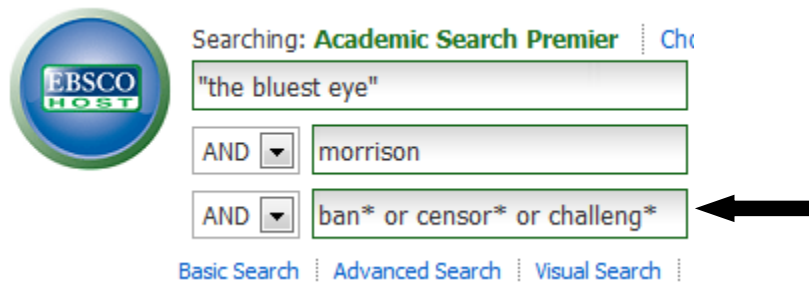
4. In the first box, type in your **book title**.



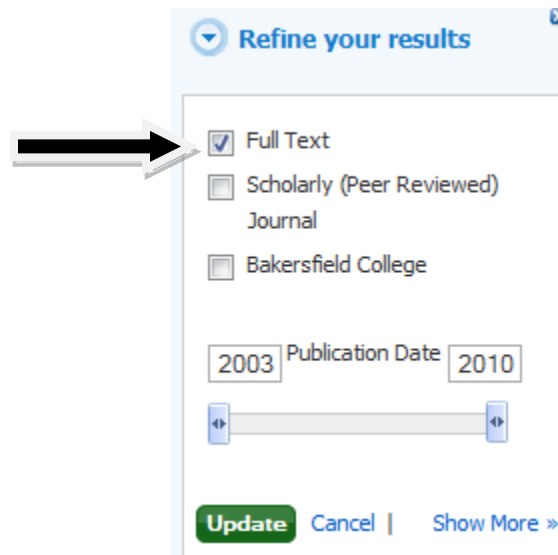
5. In the first “AND” box, type in the **author’s last name**.



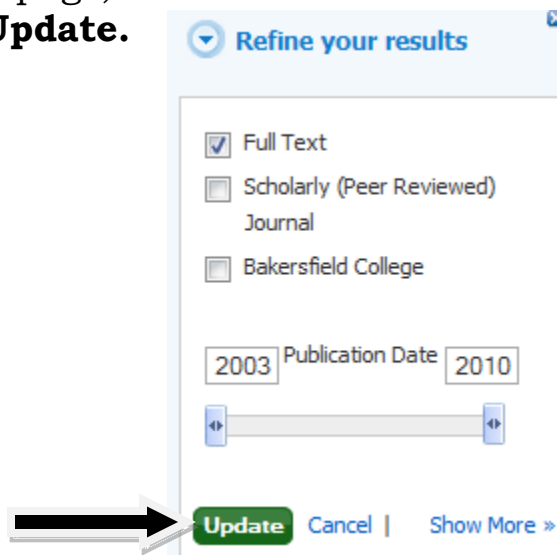
6. In the second “AND” box, type in **ban* or censor* or challeng*** (note the asterisks and the spelling).



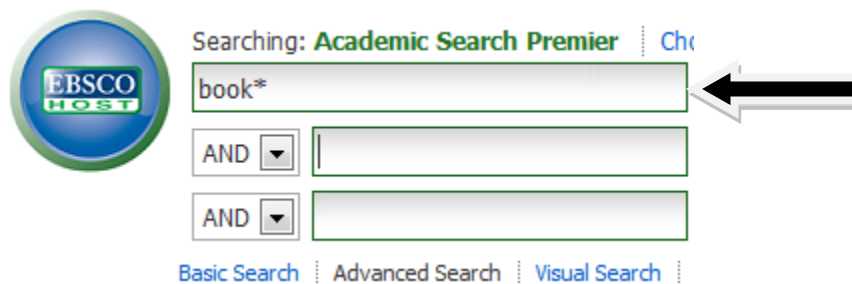
7. Under “Limit your results” check the box for **full text**.



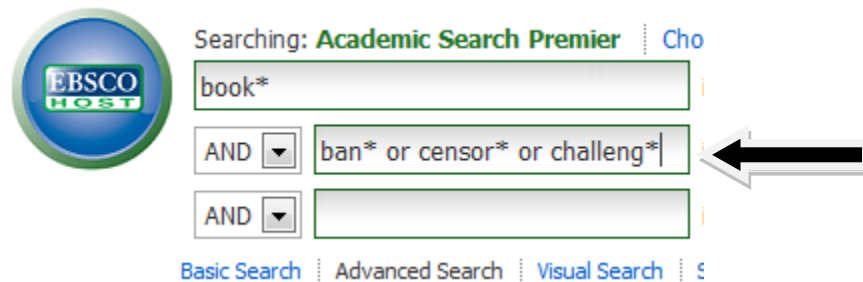
8. At the bottom of the page, check the box for **Bakersfield College**, and click **Update**.



9. Select a short article you can read, cite, and summarize in order to complete p. 136.
10. After you click on the title of a journal article, you will have several options on the right side of the screen, including the option to print and save. Remember that some articles are quite long, so you may prefer to save them or email them to yourself.
11. Return to step 5 above. In the first “AND” box, type in the word **book*** for the author or title.



12. In the second “AND” box, type in **ban* or censor* or challeng*** (note the asterisks and the spelling).



13. Return to step 7 above and complete steps 7 through 10 to search for general articles regarding book censorship.
14. You may also use the library’s reference books to find information on your book’s challenge history.
